The Rev. William J. Sullivan chair

Chancellor and past president of Seattle University, he has served on the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center Board of Trustees for three years. He also serves on board for Seattle Preparatory School and Seattle University Regents. He has served as a board member of United Way of King County and chair of the Seattle Organizing Committee for the Goodwill Games.

Former chief justice of the state Supreme Court, he is a mediator and arbitrator with the Judicial Arbitration and Mediation Service. He is one of two American judges invited to discuss genetic testing for the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development. He is a former board member of the Citizens League of Greater Spokane, the Eastern Washington University Foundation, state Supreme Court Limited practice Board, United Way of Spokane County, Nine Mile Falls School District, the Washington State Bar Association Criminal Law committee, Spokane County Legal Aid, Gonzaga University Alumni Association and Spokane County Community Services Advisory Board. He has received the American Judicature Society Herbert Harley Award, the Washington State Bar Association Outstanding Judge Award and the Medal of the Supreme Court of Canada.

Linda Mattox

A trustee for Children's Hospital and Regional Medical Center, she volunteers for social service and community organizations and has served on the boards of the Seattle Children's Home, Lakeside Parents Association and Virginia Mason Hospital Auxiliary. He is former chair and CEO of Browning-Ferries Industries, former deputy attorney general of Indiana, member of the Indiana House of Representatives, and assistant and deputy attorney general for the U.S. Department of Justice.
